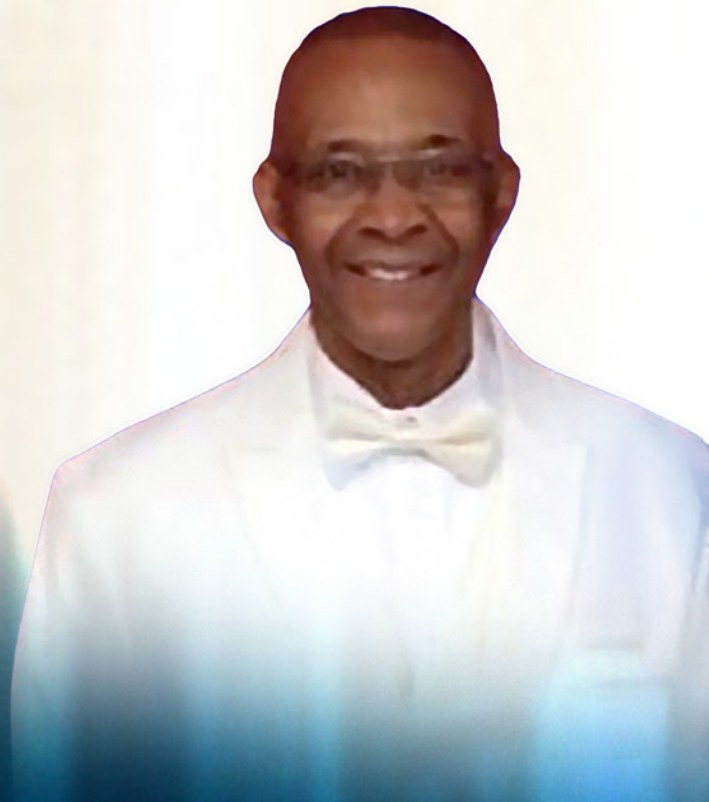

Christian:

Founded exclusively on the person and statement of Christ: "And I say that you are Peter, and that on this rock I will build my church, and that the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." (Matt. 16:18).

"It was in Antioch that for the first time, the disciples of Jesus Christ were called Christians." (Acts 11:26)

Apostolic:

"It is built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the cornerstone." (Ephesians 2:20-21)

"They persevered in the teaching of the apostles." (Acts 2:42)

Evangelical:

This word is used for the fundamental doctrines found in the Holy Scriptures. They contain the inspiration and authority of the Bible, the Trinity, the divinity and the virgin birth of Jesus Christ, his bodily resurrection and ascension to the Father's right hand, the ministry of the Holy Spirit, the second coming of Christ, the spiritual unity of believers in Christ, salvation through faith in Jesus Christ.

Evangelization has been and remains at the forefront of all activities of the New Covenant Church in Cambridge. Each of its programs reflect an evangelical character: Awakenings, Conferences, Worship Services, Teaching, Preaching, Missionary Activities, etc.

Pentecostal:

New Covenant Church of Cambridge shares pentecostal vision and principles. NCCC agrees with the movement emphasizing the permanence of the miraculous gifts that have marked the early church.

Protestant:

It adheres to the principles of Protestantism. Without disciples, there are no leaders of the protestant reformation. New Covenant Church of Cambridge believes in justification by faith, in the priesthood of all believers, the Bible as our sole authority for faith and practice and religious freedom. NCCC believes that the church should be separated from the government.

MISSION

Under the authority of God and His Word, New Covenant Church of Cambridge exists to spread the gospel of Christ; convince skeptics; deepen the faith of believers; bring as many people as possible to the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ; teach believers what Jesus taught us; to love one another; visit the sick and the prisoners; help the poor; fellowship; communion among believers and pray together.

VISION

We envision a strong church in faith, word, action, love, and numbers. Where each member will be able to develop the Christian values necessary to build a faith based on the word of God, to equip oneself to better serve, to live for God, to know him, and to make him known to others. And bring as many people as possible to the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

DECLARATION OF FAITH

All members of the Ministerial and Administrative Committee of the New Covenant Church of Cambridge must adhere to the doctrinal position of this church to be elected to any ministerial position. Therefore, anyone who wants to become a member of this church must adopt this doctrine too. The doctrinal statement of the church as it is placed in the Articles of Incorporation, states the basis of its position can be found under Apostle's Creed.

Chief Apostle Dr. Frank E. Kelley, Bishop

Apostle Frank E. Kelley, Senior Pastor at the Way of the Cross Holy Church since January, 1990 is "A MAN WITH A VISION" was consecrated to Bishop and Apostle in February, 2007 by Apostle Mary Thomas and Bishop Gilbert Thompson at Jubilee Church of Boston, MA. Apostle Kelley presently serves as Bishop of the Way of the Cross Church in Dorchester and is the overseer of the National & International Council of Elders for the Way of the Cross, Inc. as Chief Apostle. Apostle Kelley is the Executive Director of Global Network Partners (GNP), started in 2011, a professional membership organization with a focus on Economic Development, Business and Finances serving local, national and global needs. Apostle Kelley was a Boston banker and financial services consultant for two decades before receiving a call to the ministry.

Apostle Kelley formerly was the Economic Affairs Development Chair and has served as Treasurer and Auditor for the Black Ministerial Alliance of Greater Boston. Apostle Kelley is a founding member and past President and Chair of Greater Boston Interfaith Organization (GBIO), a multi-denominational, multi-racial, multi-issue organization with a membership of over 100 congregations and 20 plus CDCs and community organizations and agencies.

Apostle Kelley is the Executive Director and founder of the United Christian Financial Services Association which has been an innovative provider of technical assistance and training in the areas of business enterprise

development, credit rehabilitation and counseling, housing, and organizational development since 1992. Apostle Kelley was appointed by the Massachusetts Senate to serve on Sovereign Bank's Community Advisory Board (CAB) after testifying for the Faith Community at the Banking Commission in 2000 on bank the Massachusetts bank merger.

Apostle Kelley, co-developed the NETWORK'S (IDA) Individual Development Account Asset Building and Wealth Creation Project, representing over 500 organizational affiliates, which launched a pilot Home Buying Economic Literacy project in May, 2000 starting with over 15 families and training 140 plus families who are now more educated saving regularly and meeting in weekly classes to learn about "How To Buy Their Dream Home". Apostle Kelley, also launched, a micro-enterprise small business economic literacy project of prospective entrepreneurs as to "How to Start and Maintain Your Own Business". Over 100 businesses were launched under this leadership. These asset-building initiatives were/are purported to be the most innovative and largest faith based Individual Development Account projects (IDA) in the country with projects developing in several additional sites throughout the United States and globally.

Apostle Kelley presently and continues to develop and support oversees the Way of the Cross Annual Missions for local and international missions, founding and launching the Community Relief Foundation in 2000 to help fire disaster victims, which expanded to serve hurricane victims, and to provide funding and technical assistance to help local families in Massachusetts affected by the 2009 Haitian earthquake. In 2002 Apostle Kelley launched the Way of the Cross Haitian Relief Mission, providing business development training to a fishing village in Cape Haitian. Over the years, the Way of the Cross Relief Mission has sponsored numerous missions to Haiti. In addition, Apostle Kelley has sponsored and gone on several of these mission trips, with medical teams providing medical assistance to over 1,200 individuals. Apostle Kelley worked with an architect at MIT, professors, local and international missionaries and students from Harvard, and the University of Florida to develop a 100 unit housing development in Achaia, Haiti.

Apostle Kelley launched in 2008 a radio ministry called the Bread of Life Outreach Ministries and hosted the Television program "Bread of Life Hour - An hour of Power founded in 1985!" Apostle Kelley also has hosted the Bread of life Hour program television program recorded "live" at the Way of the Cross Church and telecasted every Friday, from 2:00- 3:00pm on BNNTV - Boston Neighborhood Network Television channel 23, RCN 83, and the Internet and other Neighborhood Television channels across the country.

Apostle Kelley in the fall of 2011 spearheaded with a team of financial and business professionals reached out to over 50 existing and new and start-up businesses and sponsored an a business expo at the Kroc Center in Boston . The expo served the urban community and developed, trained and assisted these micro and small businesses providing marketing tools and promotional expertise that lead-up to two other micro/small business Expos that exposed them to new customers from the surrounding community.

Apostle Kelley, because of COVID-19, Coronavirus, 2019-2021 a long with colleagues locally, nationally and globally, through Global Network Partners (GNP), launched a Virtual and in person Financial Literacy Savings and Training Program with professional Trainers/Facilitators engaging Community, stakeholders, Family and Youth implementing Teams/Groups to bring Economic justice and income opportunities to the Elderly/Seniors, Millennials/ Middle Class, X/Y Generation, small/micro businesses, churches, non-profits and etc. Apostle Kelley's Vision since 2017 is "RE-LAUNCH" and his theme from 2002 still is: "Rebuilding the Temple of God, as God Rebuilds His Kingdom Within Us!"

Biography of Rev. Dr. Thomas St. Louis, Th.M.



Rev. Dr. Thomas St. Louis is the Senior Pastor and Founder of New Covenant Church of Cambridge (NCCC) in Waltham, MA which was established in 1984. He began his call to ministry at Bourdon Theological Seminary in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. While in seminary, Dr. St. Louis met and later married Rev. Dr. Esther (Charles) St. Louis, his sweetheart and right-hand partner in ministry, who helped establish the NCCC. Together last November 2024, they celebrated 49 glorious years of marriage by God's grace, and the celebration continues!

After Seminary, the couple travelled to various corners of Haiti sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ and bringing new hope to many. Drs. Thomas and Esther St. Louis immigrated to the U.S. in the 1970s. Shortly thereafter, Dr. St. Louis obtained his Doctor of Divinity from Christ Theological Seminary in Yonkers, New York and a Bachelors degree in Pastoral Counseling from Master's Divinity School of Theology Evansville, Indiana. He also received an Honorary Doctorate Degree in Theology from Jean Price Mars University in Port-au-Prince, Haiti.

Dr. St. Louis is a licensed and ordained minister both in Haiti and in the United States. Dr. St. Louis is also an itinerant speaker. He has made various missionary and evangelistic trips teaching and preaching the gospel and helping people in need in the Caribbean Islands, the U.S., Canada, and Paris, France. Dr. St. Louis teaches systematic theology and trains men and women for full-time ministry including pastoral and missionary roles at the New Covenant Church of Cambridge International Ministerial Institute and Academy established in 2012. He has also provided various human services, not only through the church, but also through his career as an activist, housing and welfare advocate and paralegal in the greater Boston area. Additionally, he has coordinated humanitarian efforts in response to the 2010 earthquake in Haiti, and continues to support numerous churches and ministries in Haiti through his leadership at NCCC.

Dr. St. Louis is a humanitarian who serves people of all races, creeds and backgrounds. He has received various honors and distinctions for his ministerial and humanitarian work. Notably, among these honors, he has been recognized for his services to the community as the "Somerville Citizen Who Makes A Difference Award" and the "Peace and Justice Award" in the City of Cambridge. Above all of this, Dr. St. Louis is a committed husband, father and grandfather. Together with his wife, Rev. Dr. Esther St. Louis, they have raised five children and six grandchildren.

Biography of Rev. Dr. Esther St. Louis



Rev. Dr. Esther St. Louis is one of eleven children raised in a Christian home in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, where her father was a pastor. God called Rev. Dr. Esther at a very young age into ministry. Rev. Dr. Esther is a licensed and ordained minister. She obtained seminary training from Bourdon, Bible College in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, Union College, Elizabeth, NJ, Voice of Hope Bible School; and later she received an Honorary Doctorate degree from Holy Trinity Theological School in Brooklyn, NY. In 1984, Rev. Dr. Esther and her husband, Rev. Dr. Thomas St. Louis, co-founded the New Covenant Church of Cambridge (NCCCW) located in Waltham, MA, a Haitian-American congregation of over several hundred members, and they also support many local and international ministries and missions.

As the First Lady of NCCCW, Rev. Dr. Esther is a spirit-filled preacher and conference speaker. She and her husband continue to pastor, evangelize and harvest souls for Christ through various ministries working with children, youth, men and women. She spearheads the prayer ministry and international missions as well. In addition, for more than forty years, Rev. Dr. Esther also has established many women's ministry groups to encourage and disciple women of all ages. Rev. Dr. Esther is the founder of the women's auxiliary group at her home church, a ministry which has helped to shape and encourage other women's ministries in the local Boston area, throughout the United States, and in countries such as Canada, Haiti and France. Furthermore, Rev. Dr. Esther traveled around the U.S., to countries in Europe, the Middle East and Haiti for ministerial training and missionary trips. More recently, she started a new ministry working to encourage a newly founded men's group in a small growing Haitian church located in Paris, France.

Rev. Dr. Esther serves as the Assistant Chairman of the Board of the Association of Women in Ministry International. Rev. Dr. Esther is a woman of many gifts including the gift of orator as well as memorizing and reciting lengthy poetry at special occasions. She is a loving wife, mother, grandmother, sister, friend and mentor.

APOSTLE'S CREED

- **WE believe** the bible to be the inspired and only infallible word of God.
- **WE believe** that there is one God eternally existent in the three persons: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.
- **WE believe** in the blessed hope which is the rapture of the church.
- **WE believe** that the only means of being cleansed from sin is through repentance, faith in the precious blood of Jesus Christ.
- **WE believe** that the regeneration by the Holy Spirit is absolutely essential for personal salvation.
- **WE believe** that the redemptive work of Christ on the cross provides healing for the human body and answers to believer's prayer.
- **WE believe** that the baptism of the Holy Spirit according to Acts 2:4 is given to believers who ask for it.
- **WE believe** in the sanctifying power of the Holy Spirit by who's indwelling a Christian is enabled to live a holy and separated life in this present world.
- **WE believe** in the gifts of the spirit which was given to the church to withstand the evil tactics of Satan.

The Preface to the Consecration & Affirmation

Since the days of the Apostles and throughout the scriptures, God used sacred offices and ministries to guide the church to the fulfillment of its earthly purpose. The earliest records of ancient Christian writers have included Holy rituals that have given the Christian Church its character and majesty. The Old and the New Testament in particular gives fine points that outline the character and duties of the Post-Resurrection Church. The Scriptures models and highlights the orders of ordained ministries that give expression to the character of the Christian Church. The New Testament Scriptures and the Book of Common Prayer outline the use and purpose of these sacred offices. The order of Apostles and Bishops are those called to lead, oversee and unite the church. They guide and teach others to fulfill Christ's Commission to the world. The Presbyters or elders are charged to govern, shepherd, proclaim the gospel, administer the Lord's ordinances and strengthen the Church's missionary zeal. The Deaconate or deacons to assist the Apostles, Bishops and Pastors in all areas of ministry, which also includes ministry to the sick, poor and the disenfranchised.

Those who are called of God and capable are recognized by the Church to the ordained ministry. Their ability and gifting is acknowledged through ceremonial prayer and the laying on of hands. Those who are so called are forever associated with the redemptive plan of God for peace and the reconciliation in the world. The act of consecration is a public affirmation of the servant's call and pledge of lifelong commitment to the cause of Christ and the Church.

The chronicles of these ancient offices date back to the first century. Each recognized candidate receives his/her consecration through the laying of hands. This act confers upon the recipient/s the history and purpose of the office. Apostles are Consecrated by Apostles, and Bishops by Bishops who are qualified to confer upon the recipient/s the rights and responsibilities of the office. This threefold ministry is a blessing from God for the up-building of His Kingdom, the nurturing and sharing of the Gospel throughout the world. In God's time, those whom God calls are publicly set apart.
